Duties and responsibilities

 To assist in the successful delivery of direct therapeutic support for children and young people

- To work collaboratively and supportively within your team of volunteers and as a group
- To assist with the smooth running of therapeutic support by ensuring resources are ready for the required activities
- To assist with the parent and carers group, when required, helping them to better support their bereaved children and young people.

Training

All therapeutic volunteers are required to undergo a full day of training during which they will learn about children's experience of the grief process and how Nelson's Journey supports these individuals. Please note that volunteers will be asked to reflect on their own lives and share any loss experiences they have had.

Safeguarding training is mandatory and will be provided by Norfolk County Council.

Upon successful completion of this training, a cleared DBS Check and two references the volunteer would then be included in email invitations to volunteer their time.

Hours: The Youth Panel and Young Volunteers meet approximately 4

times a year, usually during school holidays or half terms, for a full

day (usually from 10am to 3pm).

If supporting Youth Panel members and Young Volunteers, your

attendance at their meetings is important.

Youth Panel and Young Volunteers also support the delivery of fundraising activities and events organised by the charity across

the year, where they require adult support.

Please note that some of the Young Volunteers may have been previous Nelson's Journey service users.

Duties and responsibilities

- To assist the Young Volunteers during their meetings with discussions of new NJ services; awareness raising; and fundraising initiatives.
- To assist the Young Volunteer Co-Ordinator with the planning and organisation of Young Volunteer activities.
- To assist in the running Young Volunteer meetings; this may include the preparation of food for which additional training will be provided.
- To be an adult point of contact for Young Volunteers at events they attend throughout the year.

Training

All therapeutic volunteers are required to undergo a full day of training during which they will learn about children's experience of the grief process and how Nelson's Journey supports these individuals. Please note that volunteers will be asked to reflect on their own lives and share any loss experiences they have had.

Safeguarding training is mandatory and will be provided by Norfolk County Council.
